It's been a long time since we've been together and The Shepherd's Center of Richmond travel committee is pleased to offer a guided walking tour of historical sites in Shockoe Bottom. We'll cover approximately twelve blocks - about 1.5 easy walking miles with no hills to climb.

Walkers will meet at 10:00 am on the steps to the front entrance of Main Street Station.

Join us and see **Lumpkin's Slave Jail**: a slave-holding facility active from the 1830's through the Civil War; **City Plantation**: home of the first court clerk; **Mason's Hall**: the oldest Masonic home in the U.S. and continuously in use since 1787; **The Old Stone House**: the oldest building in Richmond is also a museum dedicated to Edgar Allen Poe; and the **Kanawha Canal Walk**: four centuries of Richmond's history seen through monuments and exhibits.

As a special welcome back promotion, the cost is \$15 for TSCOR members and non-members.

All COVID-19 precautions will be followed, including wearing face masks.

In the event of inclement weather, the tour will be rescheduled.
