IMPACT STATEMENT

The Shepherd's Center of Richmond continued to build on the momentum sparked by our move into a new administrative office on Monument Avenue. It was the perfect year for our theme: New Building – New Growth. And grow we did - expanding our reach, programs, and visibility in the community.

We kicked off the academic year with our first-ever Open House on September 13, 2024, inviting the public to learn about our programs and services, meet our volunteers, and explore ways to get involved. The event was a resounding success!

Our newly formed Events! committee kept the energy going with monthly gatherings for members and their guests. Activities included tours of Agecroft Hall, the Library of Virginia's Indigenous Voices exhibit, the Virginia War Memorial, the Branch Museum, and the James River Pump House. Members also enjoyed outings to Southern Serenity Tea Room, Blue Bee Cider, and Truckle Cheesemongers Cheese Bar, as well as film screenings of *Amadeus*, *Amistad*, *Radioactive*, and *A League of Their Own* in our new multi-use room.

The Annual Volunteer Celebration, hosted at First Baptist Church and catered by Richmond's beloved Sally Bell's Kitchen, saw record attendance. Responding to member requests, we expanded our class offerings to include an applied art course, Watercolor Painting, and a technology course, Learn to Love Your iPhone. We even launched our first summer session, featuring Beginning Spanish.

Our social media presence grew by leaps and bounds, thanks to a dedicated volunteer creating dynamic and engaging content. Regular press releases generated several features in popular local publications. Most important, we welcomed 31 new volunteer drivers to our transportation program, helping us meet the increasing demand for rides to medical appointments and grocery stores so that more older adults can remain healthy and independent.

Looking ahead, the Center's leadership is committed to sustaining this momentum - increasing awareness of our programs, services, and volunteer opportunities while expanding the ways we learn and serve together. Whatever The Shepherd's Center of Richmond becomes next is the direct result of the passion, dedication, and generosity of our volunteers and supporters.
